


Introduction


Before You Get to San Francisco


You've looked at the agenda, convinced your boss, and registered for Dreamforce.



10 Insider Dining Tips


Looking for a local's guide for the best places to eat in San Francisco? Spanning sandwiches to dessert, here are our picks.

- 1. Best place for chicken and waffles: Little Skillet, 360 Ritch St. For those perpetually on the chicken and waffles craze, this place will fill you up for \$10.50.
- 2. Burritos from pretty much anywhere:
 You're in San Francisco now, which aside
 from being the capital of beauty, also
 happens to be a delicious hub for cheap
 tacos. The Mission District is packed with
 famous taquerias.
- 3. The usual suspect: Pier 23, the Embarcadero. If you're looking to chow down on some SF-style chowder, this is the place. It's a nice lowkey spot on the water, and if you make it in time, you might catch the jazz trio.
- 4. Just dessert: Mitchell's Ice Cream, 688 San Jose Ave. If you're more into dessert than you are dinner, hop in a cab down to Mitchell's Ice Cream, take a number, and wait in line for the largest scoop of homemade ice cream.
- 5. Best sandwiches: Ike's Place, 3489 16th St. A great place for vegans and Giants fans alike, Ike's Dutch crunch bread and the fillings are legendary.


- Ø 6. Best place to dine with coworkers:
 Boulevard, 1 Mission St. You can't go wrong with fine dining in San Francisco, but this place is a keeper. Let your boss treat you!
- 7. Best sushi: Sushi Zone, 1815 Market St. Sushi lovers will delight in this hidden hole-in-the-wall. Get there early. And because this is SF, you can also find an entirely plant-based sushi joint at Shizen (370 14th St).
- 8. Best coffee: Philz, 201 Berry St., plus other locations around SF. San Franciscans are fanatic about a lot of things: composting, burritos, the Giants, and coffee. Specifically, Philz Coffee. This is not your ordinary cuppa Joe from an ordinary barista. It's delicious jet fuel that will keep you on point all day. And when we say all day, we mean a full 15 hours. Be prepared to wait in line.
- 9. Best place for a pint:
 The Chieftain Irish Pub & Restaurant, 198
 5th St. If you want to eat and drink like an Irishman while watching baseball like a San Franciscan, the Chieftain won't disappoint.
- 10. Best place for cheese and cowboys:
 Fondue Cowboy, 1052 Folsom St. You can't
 go wrong with fondue and old westerns it's
 double classy.


Pack smart.

Do you have everything you need to stay comfortable and connected? Remember to pack walking shoes, layers (it gets chilly at night), extra chargers, a backup smartphone battery, your tablet, business-casual attire, and a backpack or light messenger bag. We recommend bringing a tablet for note-taking if you have one, as laptops are heavy to carry around all day.



First of all, download the Dreamforce app if you haven't yet – just search for it in your app store of choice. Then install other important apps, like Lyft, Uber, and Flywheel for transportation; Instagram and Periscope for sharing photos and videos; LinkedIn for networking; and Evernote for taking notes during sessions.







The night before Dreamforce

Can you visualize the San Francisco fog yet? Use these tips for the night before Dreamforce.

Pack lightly.

Make sure you have your chargers, a backup smartphone battery, and walking shoes. Leave room for swag! Those free t-shirts can take up more space than you'd think, plus you'll appreciate a lighter bag around 9 p.m.

Charge devices – and yourself.

Make sure everything is charging before you fall asleep so you can hit the ground running. Avoid the temptation to stay out late the night before Day 1 of Dreamforce – you'll have plenty of time to enjoy San Francisco's bars and latenight snacks later in the week.

Download your schedule.

Save your itinerary from the Dreamforce app as a PDF and print it, just in case your phone battery dies or you don't want to drain it by frequently referring to your schedule.

If you follow these steps, you'll be feeling well prepared for Dreamforce when that very first morning arrives. So get your itinerary ready, put on your walking shoes, and head to Moscone.

Doing Dreamforce on a Budget

Dreamforce is an event for budgets of all sizes. Save money on dining and entertainment by attending one of the many Dreamforce parties that usually feature drinks and delicious appetizers (bonus: you'll meet a ton of people, too). We'll serve you complimentary breakfast and lunch during the week, so that's two meals you've got covered.

Also consider using public transportation during Dreamforce. It's inexpensive and BART (short for Bay Area Rapid Transit) can go underneath traffic-clogged streets. Stay at or near one of the Dreamforce hotels – free shuttle buses run between them and the main Dreamforce campus. You don't need to be staying at that hotel to get the shuttle, either. Just walk over and board. If you're not staying near a shuttle, pack light and dress in layers so that you don't need to go back and forth between your hotel and Dreamforce events throughout the day. As an added bonus, that's less time spent in transit and more time enjoying the event!

During Dreamforce

Many know Dreamforce as the Super Bowl of cloud computing.

It's truly epic, and you'll understand as soon as you set foot in the Dreamforce Plaza. Use the tips in this section to enjoy every minute and experience Dreamforce like a pro.

Pick up your badge.

After arriving on campus, the first thing you should do is get your badge. It's your entry point to every corner of Dreamforce. You can get your badge starting on Monday, September 14 at 2 p.m. Check your email and Dreamforce.com for additional times.



Explore the Dreamforce campus.

Moscone Center is the heart of Dreamforce.

Moscone North houses the Cloud Expo and
Product Showcase, while Moscone West houses
Keynotes, Cloud Expo, Customer Success
Showcase, Dev Zone, Admin Zone, SMB Zone,
Analytics Zone, Sales Zone, Breakouts, and
more. Moscone South also holds Keynotes, plus
Sponsor Super Sessions. There's tons to see
just by meandering around Moscone, but grab
your phone and Dreamforce app for a map of
everything.


Get all of the swag.

T-shirts, beer coozies, screen cleaners – you'll find plenty of free swag to enjoy yourself or share with coworkers. On an afternoon or morning when you don't have many sessions planned, stop by the various booths in the Cloud Expo and stock up on goodies.



Stay flexible.

Your week will go extra-smoothly if you keep a relaxed, flexible mindset. (Struggle with that? There's a Mindfulness keynote on Friday!) Have backup plans ready if a session you'd like to attend is full or you can't make it in time. In general, pad your schedule with extra time to arrive at your destinations – there's a lot of foot and car traffic in San Francisco during Dreamforce.



Top 10 Sightseeing Spots

If you have a few hours of extra time to explore outside the Dreamforce campus, visit one of these excellent sightseeing spots in beautiful San Francisco.

- 1. Walk through Chinatown: If you're looking for some authentic San Francisco subculture and killer dim sum, head down to Chinatown for an afternoon walk. Don't forget to see the Sing Chong Building.
- 2. Nighttime trip to Alcatraz: Take a boat to one of the nation's most historic prisons. Bring a jacket or two!
- 3. Giants game: Now is your chance to see the world champions in action. Where else can you watch baseball with the ocean as the backdrop?
- 4. Golden Gate Park: This is a spot that both locals and tourists enjoy. Stroll the city's open space, which includes the Japanese Tea Gardens and the Botanical Gardens. And don't be alarmed if you see a family of buffalo.
- 5. Twin Peaks (at night): If you want to view the city sparkling from above, you must hit this spot after the sun goes down. Bring a camera – this is not your typical view of San Francisco.

- 6. California Academy of Sciences: Sure, it's a great, educational place to take the kids, but they also host indoor/outdoor parties where adults can act like kids. There's even an albino alligator.
- 7. Ride the cable car: One of the many things locals take for granted around here, this is the perfect place to relish in San Francisco tradition. Hop on the Hyde Street cable car at Union Square and ride it like a rollercoaster through San Francisco.
- 8. Musee Mecanique: Head to Fisherman's Wharf to see an old-fashioned interactive museum with more than 300 rare 20th-century penny arcade games and artifacts, including coin-operated fortune tellers. You should also make a quick stop to Ghirardelli for some local chocolate.
- 9. Crissy Field: If it's not foggy, walk Crissy Field up to the Golden Gate Bridge. It's a flat pathway that lines the Bay and has breathtaking views of the nation's most iconic bridge. If you're feeling in shape, carry on and walk the whole Golden Gate Bridge. Then you'll truly earn your SF bragging rights.
- 10. Be a kid again at the Steward Street Slides: Sure, the hills of San Francisco are a tough climb, especially for out-of-towners. But they also make for fun slides. Designed by a 14-year-old but loved by San Francisco adults, the Steward Street Slides in Noe Valley are a great way to blow off some steam.

Take notes wisely.

Remember that session slides are typically available after Dreamforce, so there's no need to photograph them unless you want to tweet them.

Be socially active.

There's a lot going on at Dreamforce, and it's all perfect content to tweet, post on Instagram, and share on your other social networks of choice. We'll be live-broadcasting video on Periscope and live-tweeting major events the entire week, so follow @salesforce and @dreamforce and share your experiences using #DF15. This is a great way to find new people to follow (who just might follow you back).

Know your modes of transportation.


You have a plethora of ways to get around the city: free Dreamforce shuttles, transportation apps (Uber, Sidecar, and Lyft), cabs, public transportation, and pedicabs. Shuttle buses will be provided between Dreamforce hotels and campus venues, and a campus shuttle will service major conference locations during the event. You can also share rides with coworkers.



If you see an opportunity to grab a cup or bottle of water, take it! Hydration is key to staying healthy and focused. Breakfast and lunch will be provided during the event, and food is available at official Dreamforce evening events like the Dreamfest. San Francisco will be brimming with hungry Dreamforce-goers, so make sure you have restaurant reservations before heading to that San Francisco foodie hotspot. You can also take advantage of delivery services like GrubHub and Eat24 if you need a night in to work or recharge.

Navigate the party scene.

Many of our Dreamforce partners host fantastic evening parties around San Francisco, ranging from the casual happy hour to the all-out dance party bash. Find out party details and decide what you'll attend by reviewing the Apttus Dreamforce Party Calendar and the Partyforce app.



Get Around San Francisco Like a Local

So you made it to San Francisco – now you're ready to explore, get to the Dreamforce campus, or meet your friends for cocktail hour. Here's a list of every major transportation method in the city.

- Ride a bike: Rent a bike and brave the hills like San Francisco residents or don't, and just use it to ride the flats at Crissy Field for great views of the Golden Gate Bridge. Either way, you'll get a great workout while covering a lot of ground.
- Cable car: Cable cars are limited in terms of where they'll take you, but they're probably the most fun you'll have in San Francisco traffic.
- App-based ride-sharing: If you want to blend in like a local and you're feeling high-tech, hail a car via your smartphone using an app like Uber, Lyft, or Sidebar.
- Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART): When traffic hits, the city's transit system can be the fastest way to the Mission or the East Bay not to mention a good way to save some cash.

- Walk: If you really want to look like a local, then ditch all wheels and traverse the hills on your own two feet. Yes, you'll probably work up a nice sweat, but you'll also see some of the best views in San Francisco from all angles.
- Take a taxi: Nobody knows their way around SF better than a taxi driver. And they just might share some interesting facts about the city along the way.
- Ride Muni: Locals rely on these city buses to get across town. If you have time to kill and are looking to get around town on a budget, then Muni is fair game. Be sure to check nextbus.com for arrival updates.
- Ferry: Perhaps you're making a vacation out of your trip to Dreamforce. Good for you! Might we suggest a quick ferry ride to Sausalito? Bring your camera for some picture-perfect scenes en route. You can also take the ferry between San Francisco and Oakland.

When you've attended your last keynote and walk out of Moscone for the last time, that's only the beginning. After you leave Dreamforce, you have a clean slate to begin using all you've learned to grow your company and career.
